PETITION FOR NATURALIZATION

To the Honorable the Common Pleas Court of Westmoreland County at Greensburg Pa
 The petition of Frank Kolodziej hereby filed, respectfully sheweth:
 First. My place of residence is Latrobe Pa 113 Grant St. (Give number, street, city or town, and State.)
 Second. My occupation is miner
 Third. I was born on the 20 day of March, anno Domini 1894, at Karmanow Poland.
 Fourth. I emigrated to the United States from Trieste, on or about the 27 day of Aug.,
 anno Domini 1913, and arrived in the United States, at the port of New York, on the 19 day of Sept,
 anno Domini 1913, on the vessel Belvedere (If the alien arrived otherwise than by vessel, the character of conveyance or name of transportation company should be given.)
 Fifth. I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 19 day of Nov, anno Domini 1924
 at Greensburg Pa, in the Common Pleas Court of Westmoreland County Pa
 Sixth. I am married. My ^{wife's} ~~husband's~~ name is Rose Latrobe ^(she) ~~(he)~~ was born on the 4 day of Nov, anno Domini 1901
 at Latrobe Pa, and now resides at Latrobe Pa (Give number, street, city or town, and State.)
 I have two children, and the name, date, and place of birth, and place of residence of each of said children is as follows:
Louise 6 Oct 1921 Elizabeth 11 Nov 1926 born and live in Latrobe Pa.

Seventh. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States, and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to Republic of Poland of whom at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Eighth. I am able to speak the English language.

Ninth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 19 day of Sept, anno Domini 1913, and in the State of Pennsylvania continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the 19 day of Sept, anno Domini 1913, being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Tenth. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court. (I made petition for citizenship to the _____ Court of _____ at _____, on the _____ day of _____, anno Domini 1____, and the said petition was denied by the said Court for the following reasons and causes, to wit _____, and the cause of such denial has since been cured or removed.)

Attached hereto and made a part of this petition are my declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States and the certificate from the Department of Labor, together with my affidavit and the affidavits of the two verifying witnesses thereto, required by law. Wherefore your petitioner prays that he may be admitted a citizen of the United States of America.
