

Kiel on the eighth of August, 1885.

Before the undersigned registrar appeared today for the purpose of marriage:

1. La... (?) Friedrich Carl Samuel Netlitz, personally known through the market clerk Johannes Boller of Kiel, of the Protestant religion, born on the fifteenth of September, 1857, in Rastenburg, district of Königsberg, residing in Kiel, Annenstraße No. 45,

son of the master dyer Carl Netlitz, residing in Rastenburg, and his deceased wife Maria ... (?) Netlitz, née Großmann, last residing in Rastenburg.

2. the seamstress Anna Emilie Elise Grahl, personally recognized by the above-mentioned market clerk Boller, of Protestant religion, born on xxx July of the year 1851 in Königsberg in Prussia, residing at Kiel xxxstreet No. 6,

daughter of the late pastor Johann Carl Grahl, last residing in Königsberg in Prussia, and his wife Emilia Grahl, née Broche, residing in Kiel.

The following were called as witnesses and appeared:

3. The locksmith Johann Christian Plambeck, personally recognized by the above-mentioned market clerk Boller, thirty-one years old, residing at Kiel, Ringstraße No. 55.

4. The Blarkführer(?) Andreas Heinrich Asmus Bregas, personally known, thirty-two years old, residing at Kiel, Langenhagen No. 13.

In the presence of the witnesses, the registrar asked the engaged couple individually and one after the other the question: whether they declare that they want to enter into marriage with each other. The engaged couple answered this question affirmatively, and the registrar then pronounced that he now declares them legally married by law.
