PETITION FOR NATURALIZATION

To the Honorable the District Court of the United States at Cleveland, O.
 The petition of Wojciech Kacmarczyk hereby filed, respectfully sheweth:
 First. My place of residence is 5086 Beechline Ave. Cleveland, O.
 Second. My occupation is Punch Press Operator
 Third. I was born on the 20 day of Feb., anno Domini 1890, at Salmeron, Poland
 Fourth. I emigrated to the United States from Antwerp, Belgium on or about the 10 day of Feb.
 anno Domini 1913 and arrived in the United States, at the port of New York N. Y. on the 20 day of Feb.
 anno Domini 1913 on the vessel Finland
 Fifth. I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 7 day of Aug., anno Domini 1922
 at Cleveland, O. in the Common Pleas Court of Cuyahoga County
 Sixth. I am married. My (wife's) name is Johanna (she) was born on the 16 day of Jan., anno Domini 1899
 at Poland and now resides at Cleveland, O. with me
 I have 3 children, and the name, date, and place of birth, and place of residence of each of said children is as follows:
Chester, horn July 7, 1917, at Cleveland, O.
Roma " Feb. 4, 1920 " "
Julia, " April 15, 1922, " "
 All reside at Cleveland, O.

Seventh. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to The Republic of Poland of whom at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Eighth. I am able to speak the English language.
 Ninth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 20 day of Feb., anno Domini 1913, and in the State of Ohio continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the 21 day of Feb., anno Domini 1913, being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Tenth. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court. (I made petition for citizenship to the _____ Court of _____ at _____ on the _____ day of _____, anno Domini _____, and the said petition was denied by the said Court for the following reasons and causes, to wit _____, and the cause of such denial has since been cured or removed.)

Attached hereto and made a part of this petition are my declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States and the certificate from the Department of Labor, together with my affidavit and the affidavits of the two verifying witnesses thereto, required by law. Wherefore your petitioner prays that he may be admitted a citizen of the United States of America.
